New Cell Phone Policy to Enhance Student Learning

We understand that cell phones are an integral part of our daily lives. However, to create an optimal learning environment for all students, we have implemented a new district-wide cell phone policy. This policy is designed to minimize distractions and promote a focused learning atmosphere.

Why the Change?

Research has shown that cell phone use in classrooms can significantly hinder student learning. Our goal is to create a safe and engaging educational environment where students can thrive.

- Distractions: Constant access to phones can disrupt classroom activities and prevent students from fully engaging in lessons.
- Safety Concerns: Misinformation can spread rapidly through social media, creating unnecessary anxiety and fear among students and parents.

Policy Details

- Device Storage: Upon entering the school building, all electronic devices must be powered off and securely stored in lockers or backpacks.
- 2. Locker Security: Lockers are available for free at the school office. We strongly encourage students to use them.
- Consequences: Violations of this policy will result in disciplinary action, including warnings, detentions, in-school suspension, and out-of-school suspension. Repeated offenses may lead to a cell phone behavior contract.

- 4. Exceptions: In case of emergencies or unexpected changes in after-school plans, students may use the school phone with permission.
- 5. Extracurricular Activities: Cell phone use is permitted during extracurricular activities, athletic events, and dances. However, inappropriate use may result in disciplinary action.

- Why is the district implementing this policy?
